Memorandum of Agreement between Franklin Pierce University and the Rindge Faculty Federation

This Memorandum of Agreement is entered into between Franklin Pierce University ("the University) and the Rindge Faculty Federation ("the Federation") regarding the appointment of a Franklin Pierce University Civic Scholar-in-Residence for AY2021-2022.

- 1. The University and the Federation agree upon the creation of a part-time faculty position titled "Civic Scholar in Residence" for AY2021-22 to offer three stipended lectures in fall 2021, teach one existing Rindge course in-person in Spring 2022, potentially work with the Fitzwater Center, and receive access to Library resources.
- The faculty member holding this title shall be a member of the Federation or pay Agency Fee per Article 4 of CBA, and is subject to the compensation rates for teaching courses and all other provisions of the CBA. The individual in this position will also receive \$500 per lecture for the three Fall 2021 lectures.
- 3. The individual in this position will work with the University and the relevant program faculty in a timely fashion in order to identify the course being taught in the Spring 2022.
- 4. This appointment is non-precedential; it will be limited to one individual in AY2021-22 and the University will consult with the Federation on any future such appointments.
- 5. Any office space provided to the Civic Scholar-in-Residence for AY2021-22 shall not displace any full-time faculty member, nor any part-time faculty member in alignment with seniority provisions in Article 11 of CBA.
- 6. The University shall give careful consideration to the establishment of an annual award for full-time faculty; to carry a title and other endowment to be determined by the University in consultation with RFF.
